**Call Before You Dig: Dominion Energy Reminds Public to
Contact 811 Before Digging**
Aug. 11 is National 811 Day

CAYCE, S.C. (Aug. 10, 2026) – In recognition of National 811 Day, Dominion Energy South Carolina is reminding homeowners, landscapers and contractors to contact 811 before starting any digging project so underground utility lines can be marked.

State law requires anyone planning to dig to contact 811 at least three full business days before starting a project to request underground utility markings. Whether a contractor completing a big project, or a homeowner working on a DIY at-home project, locating the underground electric or gas lines before digging can save lives, avoid outages and help avoid fines.

When SC811 is contacted, professional locators are sent to mark the approximate locations of buried utility lines with paint or flags. The 811 service is free of charge and supported by South Carolina's utilities to protect communities from accidental damage to underground utility lines.

Dominion Energy South Carolina has received nearly 270,000 requests to locate underground natural gas lines in 2026.

"Excavation damage continues to be the leading threat to the safety and reliability of our natural gas system in South Carolina," said Shaun Randall, vice president of gas distribution and customer solutions for Dominion Energy South Carolina. "We work year-round to raise awareness on the importance of contacting 811 and digging responsibly to protect our underground electric and natural gas infrastructure. Every locate ticket represents a simple step that helps keep our neighbors and community safe."

Four things to know for safe digging:

1. **Call before you dig.** Before digging, contact SC811 at least three full working days before beginning any digging project by visiting sc811.com or dialing 8-1-1.
2. **Wait for the utility lines to be marked.** At no cost, professional locators will mark the location of the utility lines on the requested property. Once it is confirmed the utilities have been marked, it is safe to begin the digging project.
3. **Respect the markings.** Carefully dig by hand within the 24-inch tolerance zone – or safety buffer – on either side of the markings to expose facilities. Mechanical equipment is not permitted within the tolerance zone.
4. **Dig with care.** If a utility line is accidentally damaged, no matter how minor it may seem, move to a safe location. From a safe place, call Dominion Energy South Carolina at 1-800-815-0083.
